Any worsening burn injury

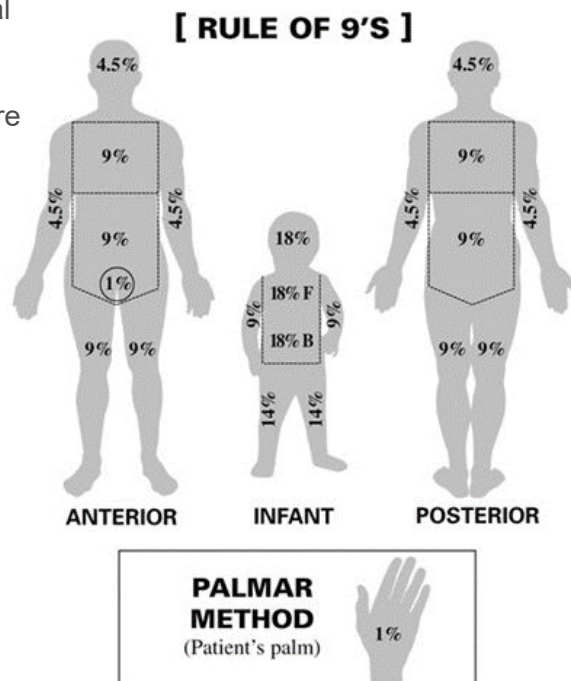
If you are prescribing a topical
medication

Any burn injury that will require
treatment for greater than 5
days

Any burn injury you feel
requires follow-up

Guidelines for Referral to the Emergency Center

- * Any burns >1% TBSA
- * Any burns larger than the palmar surface of the patient's hand (*reference Palmar Method below)
- * Burns to any high-risk location such as face, hands, feet, genitalia, perineum, or major joints
 - * Electrical Injury
 - * Chemical Burn
- * Suspected Inhalation Injury
- * Patients with chronic conditions affecting wound healing
 - * Any Suspected Non-Accidental Injury
 - * Old Burn Injuries >24hrs
