General Writing Best Practices

- The average American reads at a 7th-8th grade reading level. Remember this when writing anything public-facing. We want our audience to understand what we are saying.
- Tense: The majority of content is to be written in present tense. However, some items we write will be in past and future tense, as well. Just use your judgement on what suits best.

- Voice: Most writing should be in active voice. Again, use your best judgement, and if passive voice seems acceptable in certain instances, do use it.
 - Example: UMC provides great care (active) vs. The great care is provided by UMC (passive)
- Point of view: In most instances, write about UMC in first-person perspective. We aren't afraid of talking positively about ourselves and take ownership of our own accomplishments!
 - Example: We are excited to announce that UMC IT has earned the 2020 Digital Health
 Most Wired recognition from the College of Healthcare Information Management
 Executives (CHIME)! This means UMC IT has shown great performance on applying core
 technologies to improve care in our community.
- Avoid the overuse of acronyms in writing, they just confuse people
 - UMCP, RAPP, etc.
- Only ONE space between a period and the next sentence. The use of two spaces is an outdated practice

- UMC's External Tagline: Our Passion is You

- **Dates:** follow AP Stylebook
 - Fully spell out all months and place a comma at the end of all dates, unless they are at the end of a sentence
 - UMC and Encompass Health to hold grand opening celebration on May 15,
 2020, for new rehabilitation hospital
- **Days**: spell out, don't abbreviate
 - Monday, Tuesday
- **Phone numbers:** periods separating numbers, *always* include area code, no parenthesis around area code
 - 806.775.8200
- Addresses: abbreviate street, avenue, etc. with a period. Don't abbreviate names of buildings or suite numbers
 - 808 Joliet Ave., Suite 320
 - Medical Office Plaza I
 - Medical Office Plaza II
- Physician Titles: No periods between letters
 - MD
 - DO
- Nurse Titles: typically don't have any periods between the letters
 - _ RN
 - LVN
- Advanced Practice Professional- refer to as professionals not providers.
 - Titles: don't have any periods between the letters

Primary Care Provider (PCP)

- Because UMC has both physicians and advanced practice professionals who act as primary care providers, we use the phrase **Primary Care Provider**, rather than Primary Care Physician.
- Each first reference should be Primary Care Provider, subsequent references PCP abbreviation is acceptable
